Contraindications:

- 1. Hypersensitivity to **amitriptyline**, **chlordiazepoxide**, or any excipient.
- 2. Severe liver dysfunction, narrow-angle glaucoma, or urinary retention.
- 3. Recent myocardial infarction or serious cardiovascular disorders.
